Registration will be accepted on a "first-come-first-served" basis, and fees are due at the time of registration. We are unable to accept phone or e-mail registration. Cancellation Policy: Refunds will be granted upon cancellation notice as follows:

After registration deadline: No refund

A full refund will be granted for a medical emergency and if a signed note from the doctor is provided.

Age requirements: Camps are listed by age, and are based on the camper's age on the dates camp is in session. Age-appropriate activities are planned for each session.

Food and Drinks: Make sure your child has a lunch Monday through Friday (unless otherwise notified). An afternoon snack will be provided. Your child will be given a water bottle to use throughout the week. Please make sure your child brings the water bottle EVERY DAY. Water will be available at all times.

What else should campers bring? Your child should dress appropriately for the weather. On Monday, campers need to bring an extra set of clothes (shorts, shirt, shoes, socks, etc.) as well as a bathing suit and rain wear, to keep at camp for the week. Open-toed shoes and sandals are NOT acceptable. Hats, sunglasses, sunscreen, and insect repellent are also recommended.

Camp staff are trained and have experience working with children of all ages. Preservation Parks volunteers might also work with the camp staff. All staff members and volunteers have undergone a background check and have been trained in CPR and first aid.

Transportation: When trips are provided, campers will be transported to sites outside of Deer Haven Preserve and Gallant Farm in vans, driven by Preservation Parks staff members. Transportation permission forms are included in the registration information.

Discipline: Our staff strives to make each session a fun, educational and safe experience for all campers. Please see the registration materials for more information on expected camper behavior.
