'Bee' on the lookout for these programs

Hive Days – Three impromptu programs over the course of the summer offer visitors a look inside the bee hives at Deer Haven Preserve, and help them learn about the lives of these important pollinators. The programs are weather dependent, so watch for announcements on Facebook and other social media.

Honey Harvest (late June – mid July) – Join us at Deer Haven Park to learn about how bees both pollinate our food and "make honey from sunshine"! Take full, ripe frames of honeycomb straight out of the hives with your own hands. Then take those frames back to the "Honey House" to uncap them and "spin" the honey out in the extractor. Finish the day by bottling up a small sample of the freshly harvested honey to take home with you!
