Bluebird Box Monitor Training - January 11, 10:00-noon

Preservation Parks seeks volunteers to monitor trails of Bluebird Boxes within our Park Preserves this Spring and Summer.

Checking a trail of Bluebird Boxes is a great way to get face to face with nature. Volunteers say that their weekly "chick checks" are something they thoroughly enjoy. The experience of trekking off trail to witness a growing family of birds is as exciting as it is meaningful.



Bird Box Monitors check nest boxes weekly from April through September to record the

species found, and the number of eggs and young present. Volunteers are trained to identify cavity nesting birds, and to enter data into the online NESTWATCH database. They also must be willing to trap and kill house sparrows.

If this volunteer opportunity interests you, then please attend the Bluebird Trail Monitor Workshop hosted at Deer Haven Preserve on Saturday, January 11, from 10:00 to noon.

Build-a-Bluebird-Box Workshops- Wednesday, February 19 & 26

Timberdoodle Time- Thursday, March 20 at 7:30 p.m.

Take part in a special adventure with a Naturalist and witness the amazing breeding behaviors of the American Woodcock. Enjoy a brief talk on their natural history and what we will be looking and listening for during their elaborate Woodcock courtship display.

The hike takes place at Gallant Woods Preserve at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, March 20. Depending on where the birds are, we may take a hike. Bring a lawn chair in case the birds stay in one area.

Invasive Plant Removal Training- Saturday, March 29

Preservation Parks protects wildlife diversity and natural habitats throughout the Park District. However, we battle invasive plants such as garlic mustard, multiflora rose, and honeysuckle which grow aggressively in the parks. These invasive plants take over the forest floor, choking out desirable wildflowers and native plants. With less plant variety growing within the habitat, a chain reaction is started which limits the ability of other plants and wildlife to flourish. Preservation Parks has launched a campaign to remove invasive plants, and volunteers are needed to help.

Volunteers are invited to attend an **Invasive Plant Removal Training** and be part of this team which will help eradicate these unwanted plants from the parks. Volunteers interested in continuing to pull invasive plants throughout the spring and summer may apply for an off-trail permit and may visit the parks on their free time to remove these weeds. The Invasive Plant Removal Training will take place at Shale Hollow Preserve from 10:00-noon on Saturday, March 29. Please wear long sleeves and boots, and bring a pair of garden gloves.

Participate in the Ohio Certified Volunteer Naturalist Program

The Ohio Certified Volunteer Naturalist (OCVN) program is coming to our area this Fall! Preservation Parks is a key partner in this new Central Ohio OCVN Chapter, and we encourage park volunteers to participate in this incredible training. Details are still being finalized, but here is what we know now...

What is involved?

- There will be a registration fee and an application process.
- The training involves 40 hours of combined classroom and field instruction, covering a wide variety of natural history topics, over a two-month time span.
- Each participant commits to 40 hours of approved volunteer service projects.
- After certification, 20 hours of volunteer service and 8 hours of advanced training are required annually.
- New and exciting leadership opportunities will be available to OCVN graduates.
