## From the Director

**Stride Right ...** Walking. Henry David Thoreau wrote one of his more popular essays on the subject, and the talking heads on cable tout its cardio and physique-slimming benefits. It was our first mode of transportation and anchored us to the planet in a tactile manner that provided our senses with a three hundred and sixty degree submersion in the natural world. With eyes absorbing the immediate environment and panoramic vistas, ears unburdened by "buds" and open to the melodies of nature's compositions, and skin responding to the sensation of sun and wind, our ancestors ventured forth acquiring a worldly consciousness via their feet.
